Awards

Dr. Margaret Heitkemper received the inaugural Outstanding Nurse Scientist Award from the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science (CANS), October 2006. The Outstanding Nurse Scientist Award acknowledges CANS members whose sustained programs of research have had a significant impact on nursing and healthcare knowledge development with recognizable benefit for nursing practice and health care.

Dr. Heitkemper was also selected by the newly established National Palliative Care Research Center to serve on its Scientific Advisory Council (SAC) for a three-year term. Composed of internationally

prominent scientists, the 10-person council will oversee the research mission and agenda of the MPCRC and give final approval for all research grants, collaborative projects and junior faculty career development awards.

Vicky Hertig PhD, RN received a meritorious poster award for research entitled "Relationship Between Stress and Symptoms in Women with Irritable Bowel Syndrome" at the national State of the Science Congress in Nursing Research sponsored by the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science in Washington D.C. October 15, 2006. Co-authors on the research were Kevin Cain PhD, Monica Jarrett PhD, RN, and Margaret Heitkemper PhD, RN. Funding provided by NIH/NINR NR04101 and T32 NR07039.
